

Just As You Are by Sonja Lowe Grant Writer and Resident Dramaturg Taproot Theatre Company

"Just as I am, without one plea..."
Did you ever sing that hymn in church? In the church that I grew up in it was always the invitational directly following the sermon. For me, it encapsulates the deep and profound truth that all are welcome; all are loved by Christ, even me, "just as I am."

I don't know about you, but I find that a lot of church services don't put this truth to the test. All too often we bring a carefully edited version of ourselves to Sunday morning. Pleasantly cheerful, but never disruptively exuberant. Revealing slight troubles and worries in carefully phrased prayer requests—but never anything too extreme.

It makes me wonder sometimes, what if we didn't

edit ourselves on Sundays? What if church felt like Truvy's Hair Salon in *Steel Magnolias?*

When you come see Steel

Magnolias at Taproot Theatre Company, notice the fact that all of the women in Steel Magnolias enter Truvy's "just as they are". There is never any pretense because that's not the point of Truvy's. They walk through her doors spitting mad, deliriously happy, terrified about the future or broken with grief. They let it all out at Truvy's...and in the process they find healing in community. It strikes me that Truvy's salon is able to be a healing space precisely because each of these women are real with each other. They bring all of their lives and all of their messiness into that salon and they are accepted. That acceptance builds a trust between them that allows them to be equally real about the next crisis.

Grace Grants February 2020

I am excited to announce that the application process for Northwest Washington Synod Grace Grants is open. Thanks to the vision



and desire for continued ministry, Grace
Lutheran, Bellevue gave the synod council a
percentage of their proceeds when they closed
their ministry. The synod council, in turn, wants
to invest this money in congregations and
ministry sites who are doing faithful innovation.
In that spirit, Grace Grants were born.

For each of the next three years, \$100,000 will be made available for congregations and ministry sites to apply for Grace Grants. If other congregations, institutions or individuals would like to contribute to this-fund, the synod council will continue Grace grants beyond these initial three years.

Congregations and ministry sites are welcome to apply for grants ranging from \$2,000 to \$20,000. The council welcomes all applications. In particular, the Grace Grant Committee and synod council are looking for congregations who are faithfully looking into the future, trusting God, and seeing new possibilities in sharing the story of Jesus.

As you consider these grants, these questions might help you discern what God is up to in your area of the synod:

- What is happening in your church's neighborhood? Where do you see possibilities for partnership or collaboration?
- · What is our unique ELCA identity and witness?
- Are there avenues to talk with and listen to those outside the walls of the church?
- How can we equip disciples and our own community of faith?
- How can we foster a spirit of connection across the synod?
- What are the resources needed to develop new leaders?
- How can we partner with young adults, listening and collaborating?
- Where are the places we can be more ecofriendly in our church buildings?
- · Who are those marginalized?
- · Who are those discriminated against?

Of course, there are other areas to consider for ministry through these Grace Grants. These are just a few ideas that might help.

As you prepare, here are some important dates:

- February 1 Grant Application Period open, find form on synod website.
- · May 1 Applications due. No late applications

will be accepted.

- · May Grant committee review will take place.
- · June 5 Final approval of Grants by Synod Council.
- June 6 Notification of grants awarded at Synod Assembly.
- July 1 Grants to be funded

Grants need to be used between July 1, 2020 & April 1, 2021. Grants are potentially renewable.

I hope you find this opportunity as exciting as the Northwest Washington Synod Council. We are excited to continue vitalizing our congregations and ministry sites into the future – as we trust God is walking with us, leading us and guiding us.
